Mr. Maddrey was the 1984 Southern Section President and served as the North Carolina Ellis Cannady Chapter, IAEI Secretary-Treasurer from 1971 to 1984.

His career with the North Carolina Department of Insurance was from 1960 until his death in 1984. He was employed in the State Electrical Inspector Division.

All who knew David were well aware of his dedication to the advancement of safety and the protection of life and property from the hazards of electricity and fire. David accumulated a wealth of knowledge over his more than forty years' experience in the electrical field and always welcomed an opportunity to share this knowledge with others. He derived a great deal of pleasure from serving his fellow man. He never refused to help someone who truly needed his assistance even when it cost him a great deal of time away from his family that he loved dearly.

David B. Maddrey Scholarship Fund, Inc.

The purpose of this Scholarship Fund is to provide for financial assistance to those persons who are seeking continuing education and/or further education.

I. The Fund may grant scholarships in two categories:

1. To an electrical inspector or inspectors, qualified by the North Carolina Code Officials Qualification Board.
2. To a person or persons who is/are pursuing a course of study in the electrical field.
